Thank you for your interest in music lessons in 2025. At AspirA we treat each student as an individual. We take into account your personal interests and work alongside you to motivate you to reach your potential through music. We can take you through exams or for your own and others' enjoyment. Styles taught include Classical, jazz and all styles of rock/pop. We teach piano, keyboard, theory, drums, guitar, bass guitar, singing, composition/arranging, songwriting, music technology, and tutor in high school music (QCAA and IB). Please enquire if you are interested in lessons on instruments not listed above as we work within a network of music teachers and will do all we can to help.

Why choose AspirA music?

We are local - we are based in Springfield Lakes and we have networks within the greater Springfield area with local schools and community organisations to provide opportunities for our students in the local community. Our students were given the opportunity to perform at the New Year's Eve event at Robelle Domain and many perform at local school events. Our annual concert is held in Springfield Lakes.

We are versatile - we can teach in all styles, for exams, or just for your enjoyment and personal growth.

We get results - in 2024, or the 16 students who completed grades, everyone passed, with 9 achieving an A, 3 achieving a B+ and 2 B's; our students are also successful in local eisteddfodau.

Online access - parents and students are provided with a login to access lesson notes, schedules, invoices and more.

Experience - Daniel, the Principal and Founder of the school, has over 30 years experience teaching piano and other instruments, as well as having taught secondary music for over 20 years. He brings this experience not only to every student he teaches, but in training every teacher who is employed at AspirA.

We are qualified - Daniel is a professional member of the Qld Music Teachers Association and is a registered teacher in Qld. Teachers are selected according to their tertiary qualifications or significant experience in teaching.

Professional development - teachers at AspirA are encouraged to participate in regular professional development opportunities, whether they be held in-house or by outside organisations.

BodyMinded - Daniel is an accredited BodyMinded practitioner, which gives him a unique insight into how our bodies work and how to effectively use our bodies to play piano with ease and enjoyment.

Focus on growth - we are always looking for ways to expand our roster of teachers to provide more opportunities for our current and prospective students.

There have been many studies done about the benefit of music lessons and the positive effect they have on our learning and the state of our brain. Below are six points taken from the <u>parents.com</u> website.

Music lessons:

develop physical skills (co-ordination and motor skills) improve academic skills

refine discipline and patience cultivate social skills

boost a person's self-esteem introduce children to other cultures

I would like to add to that list that music playing is *fun* and allows us to feel a sense of achievement through positive self-expression.

In 2025, fees will be \$37-44 inc GST, according to each teacher's experience and/or training. These fees are in keeping with the rate recommended by the Qld Music Teachers' Association.

An early payment discount of 2.5% is applied when the full term is paid for by the due date.

We offer a family discount for members of the same immediate family. Where the total number of lessons in one family is 90 minutes or higher per week, a 5% discount will be applied. Some examples of how his could work are:

- Three family members taking a half hour lesson each.
- Two family members learning, one for half an hour and another for an hour.
- One person getting lessons on more than one instrument, with the total number of minutes being 90 or higher.

Most of the lessons we teach are individual lessons, and most students take a half hour lesson each week. Longer lessons are offered to advanced students and sometimes 20 minute lessons are more appropriate for very young students. Depending on interest, we can also teach classes for children, classes in theory, or small groups of two or three students. Fees for this will vary but will be less than that for individual lessons. Please enquire for further details.

We also offer a bursary programme for families with financial difficulties. Money has been generously donated by some of our parents and this can be used towards reducing the cost of lessons for a period of time or covering the cost of lesson books. Please enquire if you'd like more information about this programme.

Students will also be given opportunities to perform for family and friends in our annual student concert. This helps with building confidence, provides an excellent goal to motivate students to work hard on perfecting their pieces and gives students a sense of positive achievement. It also gives family and friends an opportunity to hear the great work achieved throughout the year and to celebrate each student's achievement.
